Located in downtown New Britain, this development was originally started by a for-profit developer who was unable to assemble all of the necessary financing for the project. MHAGH stepped into the project in 2010, raising the needed funds and completing the project in February 2011 during the difficult economic climate. The building was constructed in 1927 for the Commercial Trust Bank and then for many years it was home to New Britain Savings Bank. When it was originally built the owner paid homage to New Britain's "Hardware City" reputation and included images of anvils in the exterior brickwork and interior finishes. In addition to 28 apartments Anvil Place also has 7,000 square feet of magnificent historic commercial space.
